There are certain flowers that attract butterflies – do a little research, or involve a grandchild to help you find out what you can plant and watch the butterflies gather.

This year our Farmer's Market will be done differently. We will be following CDC recommendations to keep you safe. There will be NO distribution inside of the center. All distribution will be done curbside in cars in the front of the building. If you meet the guidelines, you will need to call the center to request an application to be mailed to you. Receiving an application does not mean you are guaranteed vouchers! You will bring the application to the center on Tuesday June 16 at 9:00 am and vouchers are handed out on first come, first serve basis.

You must be 60 years of age or older, and have an income at or below 185% of the poverty guidelines - Single person \$23,606 or Multi Family \$31,894.
