The US and Canada celebrate the end of WWI every year on November 11, 1918. Commander Richard E. Byrd and crew of three became first to fly over the South Pole, November 29, 1929.

Parker Brothers introduced the world to the Monopoly game on November 5, 1935. On November 18, 1963, Bell Telephone Company introduced to the public the push button phone.

John F. Kennedy was assassinated on November 22, 1963.

The Reverend Jim Jones led over 900 of his followers to their death in a mass suicide, the largest in <u>history</u>, at Jonestown on November 19. 1978.




